



HORTICULTURE

Age Divisions: Youth (5-8), Junior Youth (9-13), Senior Youth (14-19), Senior (20 & up)

1. Any flowering plant in a 4" to 12" hanging container. Basket must contain all hanging equipment with watering saucer attached.
2. Any foliage or flowering plant in a container no larger than a 3-gallon (10") size with watering saucer. Entry must be repotted from the original nursery container.
3. Potted flowering plants are appreciated primarily for the quality of the blooms.
4. Any plants having special requirements MUST have care instructions attached.
5. Exhibitors may enter only one specimen of each variety in each section. Number of total entries will vary by section.
6. Flower arrangements may be either fresh or dried, but no commercial arrangements will be accepted.
7. Superintendents and/or judges have the authority to disqualify any items they deem inappropriate.
8. Cut flowers:
 - a. Exhibitors may enter up to 5 differing single stem flowers.
 - b. All specimens will be exhibited in bud vases provided by exhibitors.
9. All specimens will be judged for horticultural perfection.
10. Fruit, Vegetables & Field Crops:
 - a. An exhibitor may display only one item per class.
 - b. "Unusual" is defined as fruits/vegetables/herbs not commonly grown in this area (i.e. bananas, oranges, lemons, etc.)

DIVISION I - POTTED PLANTS

SECTION A – HANGING AND PATIO PLANTS

- 1) Single specimen foliage plant in hanging container
- 2) Single specimen flowering plant in hanging container (Must be in bloom).
- 3) Fern – one plant variety
- 4) Two or more plant varieties in hanging basket
- 5) Two or more plant varieties in patio containers
- 6) Any other hanging or patio plant

SECTION B – POTTED FOLIAGE PLANTS

- 1) Bromeliads
- 2) Fern
- 3) Herbs
- 4) Philodendron
- 5) Croton
- 6) Caladium
- 7) Any other plant

SECTION C – POTTED FLOWERING PLANTS

(must be in bloom)

DIVISION II - CUT HERBS AND FLOWERS, & FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

SECTION A – CUT FRESH HERBS

- 1) Basil

SECTION B – CUT FLOWER (1 stem, 4" to 6" - in vase)

SECTION C – FLORAL ARRANGEMENTS

Includes arrangements, wreaths, wall hangings, etc. in which flowers and greenery are used as a major part of the exhibit. NO artificial materials may be used. When appropriate, the container will be judged as part of the exhibit.

- 1) Arrangement of cut flowers
- 2) Arrangement of dried native materials
- 3) Wreath or wall hanging – herb
- 4) Wreath or wall hanging – dried native materials
- 5) Wreath or wall hanging – living
- 6) Arkansas farming or country industry themed arrangement

DIVISION III – FIELD CROPS, VEGETABLES AND FRUITS

SECTION A – FIELD CROPS

- 1) Cotton (1 stalk)
- 2) Field Corn (3 ears or 1 pint)
- 3) Sweet Corn (3 ears or 1 pint)
- 4) Indian Corn (3 ears or 1 pint)
- 5) Pop Corn (3 ears or 1 pint)
- 6) Beans (6 pods)
- 7) Peanuts (1 vine)
- 8) Peas (6 pods or 1 pint)
- 9) Rice (25 heads or 1 pint)
- 10) Soybeans (3 stalks or 1 pint)
- 11) Wheat (25 heads or 1 pint)
- 12) Any other field crop (hay, sunflower, milo, sorghum)
